Lakeshore Students Are Lurking in the Shadow of Lowell High

The San Francisco Architectural Foundation is currently holding its annual High School Design Competition. Participants are charged with designing a proposed Sailing Center on Pier 7 near the Ferry Building, overlooking the picturesque San Francisco Bay. Students will plan the building and the surrounding pier that supports viewing, learning, and experiencing the rich history and culture of sailing in the San Francisco Bay Area.

The center will showcase to the public the rich history of America's Cup and sailing. The center will also be a resource for the local community and visitors to San Francisco, teaching those interested how to sail. This center will serve as a combination exhibition space and classroom and will be situated on a 200' x 200' foot pier. The pier will be open to the public and will foster a wide range of activities including viewing the Bay, fishing, sailing, exercising, and eating, in addition to other planned activities and events.

Architect students from our neighboring *Lowell High School* campus are currently working on projects as part of the competition. Mr. Glover's second grade students have been invited to conduct field research by visiting architect students in their design studio at Lowell as they prepare plans and presentation materials for a proposed *Sailing Center*. Room Two students will not participate in the high school completion as an official entry but by "shadowing" the competition, through their research with students from Lowell High School as a source of inspiration for their own *Sailing Center* project for *Pier 7*.

Mr. Glover's students have begun to look at the rich history of the San Francisco Bay; its original inhabitants the *Ohlone Indians*; explorers from other lands; military presence; new settlers, how it has been used and changed in size since the early 19th century (1849); how the Bay has been filled to provide more space for ports, more area for industry, more runways for airports, more land for houses, and a place to get rid of the region's garbage; conservation efforts; and the beginning immigration of the rich ethnic diverse cultures that call San Francisco home today.
