## Back-to-School Night

#### **Nut Awareness**

As we settle in to our school-day routines, it's important to consider what we bring for lunch and snacks. More and more of our classrooms are becoming nut-free because our students have serious allergies to nuts.

Please refrain from brining anything with peanuts or tree nuts (walnuts, hazelnuts, almonds, Brazil nuts, macadamias, pistachios, pecans, pine nuts and cashews). The most common culprits are nut butters and Nutella but remember to check any times like granola mix, trail mix, and snack bars you put in your child's lunch as these can contain nuts. ## School Site Council (SSC) has open positions

Lakeshore will be holding elections for its School Site Council (SSC) later this month and we are actively looking for parents and community members who are interested in helping to decide on important school-related matters. Lakeshore's SSC currently has four open parent/community members positions that need to be filled.

Every public school in San Francisco is required to have an SSC made up of ten members: five school staff members (the principal, three teachers, one staff member) and five parents/community members. SSC members are elected to their positions and serve for two years.

The SSC's main purpose is to address matters that directly affect the school and provides a channel for input from the school community. One of the SSC's most important roles is to oversee how the school's budget is allocated, including money from grants that provide additional funding for Lakeshore. The SSC is also responsible for helping to shape Lakeshore's Academic Plan, as well as other school-related policies.

- No special skill or experience is required for being an SSC member—just a desire to help our school and our students.
- The time commitment is relatively small: mainly just one evening meeting per month.

If you're interested in becoming an SSC member (or know somebody who you'd like to nominate), please submit names to Principal Matt Hartford at ssc@lakeshoreelementary.org or drop a note with the names and contact information in the office. Nominees will be contacted and included on the ballot, which will be sent home later this month. The deadline for submitting nominees is September 20<sup>th</sup>.
