Come to make new connections to the school and hopefully you will leave feeling closer to other parents, your child's teacher and the community in general. It is also my hope that you will take advantage of volunteer opportunities, as we need everyone to make this the best Lakeshore ever! We cannot do this without you.

Spotlight on: The School Site Council (SSC)

Lakeshore will be holding elections for its School Site Council (SSC) later this month so we asked SSC member Francis Graves to provide a glimpse into what it means to be part of this important part of Lakeshore.

How did you decide to join the SSC? I enjoy volunteering at the school, supporting the academic plan and promoting safety. Being elected to SSC was another way to serve.

Can you explain what kinds of things you do in meetings? A typical School Site Council (SSC) meeting includes the principal, teachers, community members and parents. During the meeting, we review the budgetary concerns of the school as well as the academic plan.

How much time does it consume (meetings and at home)? Typically, the time commitment would be five to seven hours a month.

What makes a good SSC representative?

- Reviews the meeting agenda and related materials ahead of meeting time
- Attends every meeting on time
- Maintains a positive attitude and commitment to restorative practice
- Commitment to all school children, not just one's own child(ren)

What do you hope for this year's SSC? I look forward to working together creatively to meet the needs of all Lakeshore students, families, and staff.

Can you be involved in the SSC and the PTA?

Yes, they are separate entities. Ideally, all school volunteer committees work together for the best interests of the whole school community. This includes collective achievement, safety and helping to build camaraderie among all community members.

Nominees will be contacted and included on the ballot, which will be sent home later this month. The deadline for submitting nominees is September 20th.

- Covered volunteer needs and upcoming events
