Announcing the 2014 Lakeshore Read-A-Thon Results!

After 12 days of reading, Lakeshore Read-A-thon participants have put up some impressive numbers, reading a total of **47335** minutes (beating last year's total by over **5000** minutes!). In addition, they raised over **\$8000** for the Lakeshore PTA. Many students were "Caught Reading" at school or at home and won prizes in the biweekly raffle.
