What is an IRF and why is it important to Lakeshore? IRF stands for Instructional Reform Facilitator. An IRF provides guidance and support for a school using teacher collaboration, instructional coaching, and professional development. The role of IRF is important here at Lakeshore so teachers are supported as they continue to innovate their teaching practices.

What got you interested in teaching?

Welcome Ms. Sadja by stopping by her office (Rm 19, across from the ExCEL room) to say "Hi!"


NEW Amazon Shopping Shortcut
