Prizes will be awarded to all participants, with special prizes for the top readers and fundraisers in each grade and in the school.

Special prizes to be awarded to Read-a-Thon winners are:

Celebrate Black History Month by reading award-winning African American children's book authors & illustrators selected by Lakeshore Librarian, Ms. Celena Courtney. Be sure to visit the Learning Lab at Lakeshore's library or your local public library to learn more about these (& more!) great African American writers and artists!

#### Featured Author of the Week: Nikki Grimes

Ms. Grimes began composing verse at the age of six and has been writing poetry ever since. She is the recipient of an Award for Excellence in Poetry for Children from the National Council of Teachers in English and won a Coretta Scott King Award for *Bronx Masquerade*, an homage to spoken-word poetry. She authored the New York Times bestseller *Barack Obama: Son of Promise, Child of Hope* and is the creator of *Meet Danitra Brown*, a collection of poems for young readers. A recent book, *Words with Wings*, is a free-verse novel in which readers meet Gabby, whose imagination is fueled by "words with wings that wake my daydreams."

Featured Author of the Week: Andrea Davis Pinkney
Ms. Pinkney is founder of the "first African American
children's book imprint at a major publishing company":
Jump at the Sun at Hyperion Books for Children. She is
also vice president and editor-at-large for Scholastic
Trade Books. She won a Coretta Scott King Award for Let
it Shine! Stories of Black Women Freedom Fighters. A
recent book, Sit-in: How Four Friends Stood Up By Sitting
Down, is a celebration of the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the
Woolworth's lunch counter sit-in, when four college
students staged a peaceful protest that became a defining
moment in the struggle for racial equality and the growing
civil rights movement.

Featured Illustrator of the Week: Brian Pinkney
Mr. Pinkney is the illustrator of several highly-praised
picture books for kids including Faithful Friend, Duke
Ellington, and In the Time of the Drums, for which we won a
Coretta Scott King Award. In The Time of the Drums is a
Gullah story brought into focus by Pinkney's trademark
scratchboard-on-oil drawings, about a boy and his
grandmother who are plantation slaves on an island off the
coast of Georgia. Mr. Pinkney is married to Andrea Davis
Pinkney, with whom he often collaborates on books
including Alvin Ailey, Dear Benjamin Banneker, Bill Picket
Rodeo-Ridin' Cowboy and his father, Jerry, is also an
award-winning illustrator.
