PTA Financial Update

We have raised approximately \$94,000 of the required \$101,500 needed to pay the expenses for this school year (2014-15). While additional funds are being deposited from corporate donors, we expect to end the year between \$6000-\$7000 shy of our financial commitments. The PTA accounts can cover this deficit but it will be a big hit to our reserves. Therefore, we plan to add the deficit amount into the budget for the 2015-16 school year. We do not plan to sacrifice programs to replenish the account so we will be looking for areas to cut costs and new ways of fundraising. The Executive Board will be working through different budget scenarios for approval by the membership in the kick-off PTA meeting in September.

Thank you to everyone who helped us this year. Many donated financially and many, many donated their time to help in classrooms, at school, fundraising, and community events.

California is 49th in per pupil spending, coming in at \$8,482 per student – \$3,342 (28%) below the national average. Our kids deserve better and it's through **your efforts** that we can provide an exceptional, well-rounded education for our students. Thanks to you. Thanks to your friends and family. Notes from the Garden: Huge Changes for the Learning Garden

This year, we have made some significant changes to the Learning Garden, the amazing location below the kinder yard. It all started with the most amazing Cob bench, constructed by hand for use as comfortable and whimsical seating for Lakeshore students during Gardening class. The Greening Committee continued the improvements by sponsoring a new Weather Station complete with instruments, a weather vane, a 100 pound composter, cob picnic tables, rain gage, shed and the compass rose.

As a result, the Learning Garden has become a gem on the Lakeshore campus, providing a thought-provoking teaching area not only for Gardening but the additional seating and tables allows instructors to bring classes to work outside. It's also an oasis for our staff becoming a highly sought-after location for lunch meetings, workday breakout sessions, or an area for a quick rest and meditation.

The weather station is a work in progress with many more enhancements planned. Still, it has created a strong interest to the classes who pass by daily and is reminiscent the central plaza of a small town.

Notable is the simple painted compass rose on the blacktop. It has captured the imagination of many students and has helped provide context for learning direction. Children who are waiting for tools from the shed or just passing through will stop, stand on a point, and declare, "I'm standing North," or "I live in this direction, West!"

The new Seagull team has been immensely helpful, adopting and maintaining the new composter and worm bins, caring for the greenhouse, and excavating the hillside where the tree recently fell over.

Next up: pumpkin patch planting with the kindergartners.

Gardening is more than learning about how things grow – it's the program that makes all aspects of biology, ecology and other sciences a real-world learning experience for our students.
